Highlights of Session Meetings held on December 19, 2024

- **APPROVAL** was given to the minutes of the Special Congregational Meeting held on Sunday December 15, 2024
- **APPROVED** to reaffirm an email vote by Session to call a Special Congregational Meeting on Sunday, December 15, 2024 for the purpose of electing Deb Barrick as a Deacon for the Class of 2027.
- **APPROVED** the request from Mark Spicka, Big Spring Watershed Association (BSWA) to use the Church facilities for the following activities:

Board Meetings: January 9, February 13, March 13, April 10, May 8, June 12, August 14, September 11, October 9, and November 13 (2nd Thursday each month except December and July.) \$25 donation for each = \$250. Fly Tying: January 23, 30, Feb 6, 20, 27 and March 6. (I am not sure if you have a church board meeting on Feb 20?) \$25 donation for each=\$150 Total \$400.

- **APPROVED** the request of Gale Kunkleman, Church Custodian to carry over her vacation time from 2024 to 2025. She has not used any vacation time in 2024.
- APPROVED a motion that all hourly employees of the Church can carry over unused vacation days/time into the next year only, effective immediately.
- APPROVAL was given to the Property Committee to repair the 2 outside Stained-Glass windows on the parking lot side of the Sanctuary at a cost of \$9,760. A 25% deposit of \$2,400 will be paid out of the Capital Improvement account.
- The ending checking account balance as of 11-30-2024 was \$8,629.43. Income for November was \$10,433.69 and the year to date income is \$191,413.08. Expenses for November totaled \$15,230.55 and year to date expenses were \$192,634.04.
- APPROVED Lynette McCulloch to serve as the Session Appointed Control Person for

- our new accounts that will be established with the New Covenant Trust Co.
- **APPROVED** the \$20,000 gift received from Joan Moyer be placed in the Adams County National Bank Money Market Account designating \$10,000 to be uses for Capital Improvement and \$10,000 for Checking Reserve.
- **APPROVED** permission to hold BSICC Lenten Luncheons on Fridays from Noon to 1:00 pm on 3/7, 3/14, 3/21, 3/28, 4/4, and 4/11. First United will receive ½ of the net donations for use of the building.
- APPROVAL was given to wavier the fee paid by Ted Krocheski for use of the organ for the next 6 months in appreciation for his assistance and help in dealing with the current situation with the organ.
- **APPROVED** the suggested Session and Congregational Meeting Schedule for 2025 as presented by Pastor Vern.
- **APPROVED** the suggested Worship and Communion Schedule for 2025 as presented by Pastor Vern.
- A Memorial Service will be held at the Church on Sunday, January 5th at 2:00 pm for Gary Smith, son of Dick and Ann Smith. Pastor Vern will be officiating the Service.
- Thanks, and appreciation to April Messenger for her outstanding service as an Elder the pass 6 years! She will be missed.
